
#### **ABOUT IMUN**

At IMUN, delegates gain insight into the United Nations and the dynamics of international relations by assuming the roles of UN representatives and members of other international bodies and national cabinets.

International MUN is an exciting opportunity to debate issues that confront world leaders, to draft resolutions in response to the global issues and work with others who are equally motivated and passionate about the topics of debate. The longevity and dynamic that only a conference of our size can achieve, makes IMUN one of the preeminent simulation of UN in the world.

True to the spirit of the United Nations, IMUN strives to foster a constructive forum for open dialogue on complex global issues, including international peace and security and economic and social progress. #### COUNCIL OVERVIEW



The World Health Organization (WHO) is a specialized agency of the United Nations that concerned with international public health. It was established on 7 April,1948, headquartered in Geneva, Switzerland. The WHO is a member of the United Nations Development Group. WHO is the authority for the health research agenda, setting norms and standards, articulating evidence-based policy options, providing technical support to countries and monitoring and assessing health trends. The World Health Organization has 194 member nations and provides support and information issues such as food safety, HIV/AIDS, maternal health and scientific research.

A division of the United Nations, consisting of 15 member states that settles legal disputes submitted to it by them. The International Court of Justice, also called World Court, meets in The Hague, The Netherlands. The International Court of Justice (ICJ) is the principal judicial organ of the UN. The Court has two functions: To settle, in accordance with international law, legal disputes submitted by States, and to give advisory opinions on legal questions referred to by authorized UN organs and specialized agencies.



#### COUNCIL OVERVIEW



The United Nations Security Council (UNSC) is one of the six principal organs of the United Nations, charged with the maintenance of international peace and security as accepting new members to the United Nations and approving any changes to its United Nations Charter. Its powers include the establishment of peacekeeping operations, the establishment of international sanctions, and the authorization of military action through Security Council resolutions. Formed in 1946, it is the only UN body with the authority to issue binding resolutions to member states.

The United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women, or better known as UN Women, was founded on July 2010. It is the cluster of the United Nations that upholds women empowerment and gender equality. This UN's entity is the global champion in working women's right attainable. It resolves some issues like physical violence, stereotyping, and gender discrimination in the society. One of its goal is to position gender equality as significant to the Sustainable Development Goals, and aims for a more inclusive world.



#### COUNCIL OVERVIEW



UNESCO or United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, specialized agency of the United Nations (UN) that was chartered in a constitution was signed in November 16, 1945. The constitution, which entered into force in 1946, has the main tenacity to promote international collaboration in the fields of Education, Science, and Culture. The organization's headquarters are in Paris, France. UNESCO has 195 member states and ten associate members. Most of its field offices are "cluster" offices covering three or more countries; national and regional offices also exist. UNESCO's activities have been primarily facilitative, intended at assisting, supporting, and supplementing the national efforts of member states to eradicate illiteracy and to expand the access of free education.

The United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) is also known as the United Nations' global development network. Headquartered in New York City, UNDP is committed in ending poverty. It advocates change and connects countries to knowledge, experience and resources that help people attain a better life. It promotes technical and investment cooperation among nations. It takes part in the fulfilment of SDSs and global development. In line with this, it focuses on poverty reduction, HIV/AIDS, democratic governance, energy and environment, social development, and crisis prevention and recovery. UNDP also encourages the protection of human rights and the empowerment of women in all of its programmes.

#### 1. REGISTRATION DEADLINES


 All registrations are accepted on a first come, first served basis. Once the maximum capacity is reached, the subsequent applicants will be placed in the waiting list.

#### 2. CANCELLATION POLICY

- If the retreat or event is cancelled by the organizer, you will receive a full refund (100%).
- If you cancel your participation in a retreat or event for any reason, you receive no refunds. We cannot however compensate you for airfare or travel costs incurred. In the unlikely event that the retreat or event is cancelled due to weather, natural disaster or political upheaval, we cannot guarantee a refund it will be depending on receiving a refund from the venue / tour operator we work with. To cover these risks, we highly recommend you purchase travel insurance.

#### 3. VISA

• IMUN 2019 will provide the necessary documents to support your visa application but is not responsible for your visa into Hanoi, Vietnam. All fees are non-refundable, and it is your responsibility to secure the necessary documents to enter Vietnam. IMUN will not issue refunds for delegates who are unable to secure a visa.
